## MONUMENTA

## ARTHUR K. PORTER

## Muceno, Madonna del Marzo\*

- I. The picturesque ruins of this monument, situated in a charming spot overlooking Lago Maggiore, have never been published.
- II. I know of no documents which illustrate the history of this church.
- III. The edifice consisted of single-aisled nave and an apse. To the South-East rises the campanile, which is remarkable because oblong in plan.
- IV. On the broad face this campanile has a biforum in the top story, and simply windows in the two lower stories. On the narrow side, it has a simple window in each of the three stories. It is crowned by a low pyramidal roof.
- V. Notwithstanding the crude character of the masonry, the building appears to be a homogeneous structure of c. 1150.
